RE: Native American Consultation, Pursuant to Senate Bill 18 (SB18), Government Codes §65352.3 and §65352.4, as well as Assembly Bill 52 (AB52), Public Resources Codes §21080.1, §21080.3.1 and §21080.3.2, Duarte Station Specific Plan Project, Los Angeles County

Dear Mr. Golding:

Attached is a consultation list of tribes with traditional lands or cultural places located within the boundaries of the above referenced counties or projects.

Government Codes §65352.3 and §65352.4 require local governments to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding, protecting, and/or mitigating impacts to cultural places when creating or amending General Plans, Specific Plans and Community Plans.

Public Resources Codes §21080.3.1 and §21080.3.2 requires public agencies to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding, protecting, and/or mitigating impacts to tribal cultural resources as defined, for California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) projects.

The law does not preclude local governments and agencies from initiating consultation with the tribes that are culturally and traditionally affiliated within your jurisdiction. The NAHC believes that this is the best practice to ensure that tribes are consulted commensurate with the intent of the law.

Best practice for the AB52 process and in accordance with Public Resources Code §21080.3.1(d), is to do the following:

Within 14 days of determining that an application for a project is complete or a decision by a public agency to undertake a project, the lead agency shall provide formal notification to the designated contact of, or a tribal representative of, traditionally and culturally affiliated California Native American tribes that have requested notice, which shall be accomplished by means of at least one written notification that includes a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation pursuant to this section.

The NAHC also recommends, but does not require that lead agencies include in their notification letters, information regarding any cultural resources assessment that has been completed on the area of potential affect (APE), such as:



1. The results of any record search that may have been conducted at an Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS), including, but not limited to:

A listing of any and all known cultural resources have already been recorded on or adjacent to

the APE, such as known archaeological sites;

Copies of any and all cultural resource records and study reports that may have been provided by

the Information Center as part of the records search response;

Whether the records search indicates a low, moderate or high probability that unrecorded

cultural resources are located in the APE; and

If a survey is recommended by the Information Center to determine whether previously

unrecorded cultural resources are present.

2. The results of any archaeological inventory survey that was conducted, including:

Any report that may contain site forms, site significance, and suggested mitigation measures.

All information regarding site locations, Native American human remains, and associated funerary objects should be in a separate confidential addendum, and not be made available for

public disclosure in accordance with Government Code Section 6254.10.

3. The result of the Sacred Lands File (SFL) check conducted through the Native American Heritage Commission. The request form can be found at http://nahc.ca.gov/wp--

content/uploads/2015/08/Local-Government-Tribal-Consultation-List-Request-Form-update.pdf

4. Any ethnographic studies conducted for any area including all or part of the APE; and

5. Any geotechnical reports regarding all or part of the APE.

Lead agencies should be aware that records maintained by the NAHC and CHRIS is not exhaustive, and a negative response to these searches does not preclude the existence of a tribal cultural resource. A

tribe may be the only source of information regarding the existence of a tribal cultural resource.

This information will aid tribes in determining whether to request formal consultation. In the event, that

they do, having the information beforehand well help to facilitate the consultation process.

If you receive notification of change of addresses and phone numbers from tribes, please notify the NAHC.

With your assistance, we can assure that our consultation list remains current.

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


As of July 15, 2015, Public Resources Sections (PRC) 21080.1, 21080.3.1 and 21080.3.2 requires public agencies to consult with California Native American tribes that have submitted a request to be notified of projects in their traditional/cultural use areas for the purpose of mitigating impacts to tribal cultural resources pursuant to California Environmental Quality (CEQA). You are being contacted because the City is in receipt of your formal AB 52 Notification Request: concerning projects located within the tribes traditional and/or cultural use area.

This letter serves as the Lead Agency's formal notification, pursuant to PRC 21080.1(d), that application for the Project is on-going. The City of Duarte is considering the adoption and long-term implementation of an amendment to the Duarte Station Specific Plan. The proposed Specific Plan amendment establishes the general type, parameters, and character of the development and allows for a mix of residential, office and research and development, hospitality uses, supporting commercial uses (such as retail and services), and urban open spaces. Redevelopment of the project site is estimated to be complete by the end of the year 2025, which will be the time horizon used by the Draft Subsequent Environmental Impact Report (SEIR) to assess potential environmental impacts of the project.

The Project occupies Sectioned 31, Township 1 North, and Range 10 West as depicted on USGS Azusa and Baldwin Park California 7.5 Minute Quadrangles (see Enclosure). The 19.09-acre project site is bounded by Evergreen Street and the Foothill Freeway (Interstate 210) to the north, Highland Avenue to the east, a single-family residential neighborhood to the west, and to the south, the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) railroad right-of-way, the Duarte/City of Hope Gold Line Station, and Duarte Road (APN: 8528-001-025 and -906).

Currently the Project site consists of three parcels currently developed with industrial uses totaling approximately 313,955 square feet, and a fourth parcel developed as a surface parking lot for the Metro Gold Line station. No new construction is proposed as a result of the Specific Plan amendment.


